## **Character Masks**

### STEPS:

- After you decide on your character, use tagboard or paper and masking tape to add onto the base mask form (to make horns, ears, noses, etc).
- make a paste by mixing 1 pt flour, 2 pt water, and 4 cup of Elmers liquid glue.
- Dip newspaper strips into the glue was and cover armature with strips. Cover with at least 2 layers. Smothing out the paper as you go. Let dry.
- Day 2: Paint or color the mask once its dry.

## Materials:

- · plastic mask form
- newspaper strips
- glue, flour + water or Modpodge
- masking tape

#### Day 2:

 paint/bowls/brushes or acrylic markers

Note: This project gets a "3" rating because of clean up and timing. It should take 45 min+ for buildling the mask on day 1. Painting the mask should be done after it is dry, on day 2.

# Project Short Cuts and Do Aheads

- Cover the tables with newsprint or other paper before you start for easier clean up.
- Make your glue wash ahead and keep it covered.
- For younger kids, you can pre-cut the newspaper strips. For older kids,, they can tear strips as they go.

## Watch Out For...

- Make sure your glue wash is the right consistency and not too runny.
- Make sure the newspaper strips are completely covered in the glue wash. Smooth them out onto the form to avoid irregular bumps, etc.
