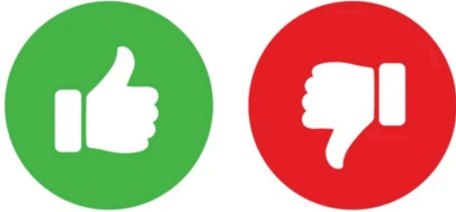


Character + Art Games

TRUE/FALSE GAME

Ask Students to create a “True” and “False card. This can be elaborate or simple. Next, have them hold up their true/false card as you read out “facts” about the character you are learning about. For older students, you can have them submit things that are true or false about the character to help generate the list.



EXQUISITE CORPSE/GROUP CHARACTER

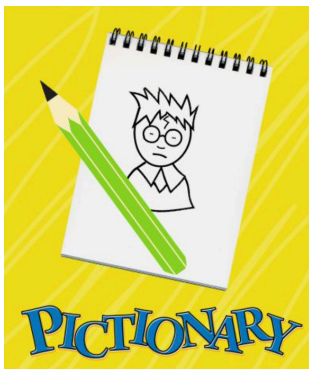
Give students a piece of blank paper. Explain that you will be creating characters together in small groups.

You will give students a prompt and they will draw that part of the character, then fold it over to hide what they drew before passing it on. Groups can be

3-5. The last person unveils the character.

Prompts can be: Hat + head, body + arms, legs + feet.

Take it a step further: color them in, display them, or have students write funny stories about them.



PICTIONARY

Ask students to write down storybook characters on small slips of paper and turn into a bowl at the front of the class. Divide the class into two teams. Taking turns, one person from each team attempts to draw the character while their teammates guess. Correct guesses get 1 point. Teams take turns. Most points win!
